**MINUTES:**

**ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS:**

COMMISSIONERS: A REQUEST IN THE AMOUNT OF \$15,151.20 TO 100-30-03-42 FOR AN INCREASE IN THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION PREMIUM. A MOTION TO APPROVE WAS MADE BY KARMIRE, SECOND EBERHART, VOTE 5-0.

AN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$20,000.00 WAS REQUESTED FOR AUDIT COSTS. COUNCILMAN EBERHART MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE COST OF THE INCREASE UP TO THE AMOUNT OF \$20,000.00, SECOND CARMONY, VOTE 5-0.

**CORONER:**

THE CORONER REQUESTED AN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,000.00 TO COVER INCREASED AUTOPSY AND LAB COSTS. COUNCILMAN CARMONY SAID THAT FOR THE 2002 BUDGET HE AND THE CORONER WILL BE MEETING TO REVIEW THE AMOUNT OF AUTOPSIES THAT HAVE BEEN PERFORMED IN THE LAST 5 –10 YEARS.

Taxpayers appearing at the hearing shall have an opportunity to be heard. After the tax levies have been determined, fixed by the appropriate governing body, and the tax rates published by the County Auditor, ten or more taxpayers objecting to the levies may appeal to the State Board of Tax Commissioners by filing a petition with the County Auditor. The petition must be filed on or before the tenth day after publication of the tax rates charged. Upon certification of the objecting petition by the County Auditor, the State Board of Tax Commissioners will fix a date for a hearing in this county.
